Maasmechelen village offers fantastic bargain prices, not only from Belgium's eclectic fashion designers, but also from some of the best global brands. The village is to be found in Limburg, and the journey takes an hour from Brussels. On Saturday and Sunday there is a free shuttle and a complimentary glass of champagne for shoppers.

SEE At the Musical Instruments Museum don the infra-red headphones and wander around the extensive collection of musical instruments from around the world. As you tour round you'll hear extracts of the spectacular sounds they can produce (2 Montagne de la Cour). GO Place Eugène Flagey is a hip district in the heart of Ixelles, due south of the

centre. The jumble

of odd architecture is a byproduct of a Belgian law that allows architects to sue for plagiarism. Check out the Flagey cultural centre, host to an array of arts events. **ESCAPE**The Folon Foundation is a 20-minute bus ride from the city centre. You'll arrive at the Château de La Hulpe, located in the splendid Solvav Park, which is where you can find the action. After a stroll around the grounds, head to the Folon Foundation, home to a fascinating retrospective of the late great Belgian artist Jean-Michel Folon (Ferme du Château de La Hulpe).
